

The Tuesday evening event will begin at 7:30 p.m. with a panel of distinguished guests who will be available to discuss relevant issues and answer questions from our audience. A confirmed panelist for this event includes Jerry Winters from the Tennessee Education Associationand Connie Smith, the Director of School

Innovation, Improvement, and Accountability for the State Department of Education..

The Wednesday morning breakfast at the Maxwell House will begin at 6:30 a.m. and will cost \$20.
