Silent Auction is not too Silent!



Yum! Broccoli and Orange Salad

Sandra Jones shared this delicious salad recipe that she brought to our August picnic. It makes 10 servings. Enjoy!

3/4 c. mayonnaise

1/4 c. sugar

- 2 tbsp. white vinegar
- large bunch broccoli, cut into 1 florets or 1 (16-oz) pkg broccoli

1/2 c. golden raisins


1/2 small red onion, thinly sliced and separated into rings (Sandra chopped hers to make it easier to eat!)

- 4 bacon slices. cooked and crumbled
- (11-oz) can mandarin oranges, 1 drained

2 1/3 c. sliced almonds (may be toasted)

Stir together mayonnaise, sugar, and vinegar in a large bowl. Add broccoli and raisins; toss well. Cover and chill thoroughly. Top with onion rings or blend in chopped onions with mayonnaise mixture to enhance the flavor. Also top with bacon and almonds
